Course name : Advanced Course for Japanese Language and Culture

This program will be cancelled due to economic constraints if the total number of applicants is less than 5.

- 2) To experience winter-sport activities in Hokkaido

Eligibility: It is expected that applicants for this international program have studied Japanese language for at least one semester (approximately 6 months) prior to their participation.

Application: The liaison offices of the respective institutions are asked to send the following documents for all applicants by air mail. **Individually sent documents are not acceptable.**

- 1) Completed application forms with recently-taken photographs (4×3cm, No background) attached
- 2) Official certificates of student enrollment and college transcripts in English
- 3) A photograph of each student's passport
- 4) Four recently-taken photographs (4×3cm, No background) with the student's name written on the back (these 4 photographs include the one attached to the application form)

Payment of Tuition :

The tuition fee for each student is **170,000 yen**. The payment of tuition must be completed before the program starts. Universities sending students to this program will be asked to collectively pay the tuition of all applicants to the following bank account:
