Identification Card	All students are issued an official Washington University student ID.

Bear Bucks	visit Campus Card Services in the Women's Building on the Danforth Campus, Rm. 002 in order to be issued your card. Hours of operation are M-F, 8:30a.m. – 5:00p.m. If you lose your ID, the cost of a replacement card is \$20. NOTE: You must present some form of positive identification with a picture ID to obtain your card, such as a passport. Bear Bucks is a cashless system on the WUSTL ID card which can be used to make purchases on and off campus. Some off campus locations that accept Bear Bucks include: Kaldi's Coffee, Panera Bread, United Provisions. Transportation	U-Pass: The St. Louis Metro travels via metro or bus directly to several locations in the St. Louis area. Washington University and Metro work together for the U-Pass program. The program provides free Metro passes to full-time students. You must complete a U-Pass request form, which may be completed online, in order to be issued one. Students must renew their U-Pass each semester and their course registration must be complete in order to request a U-Pass.
