Application

Exchange students must be nominated by one of our partner universities and will then be sent an application form. Applicants must ensure they have a passport, their most recent transcript of results, an academic reference and their English language test results. They will also have to write a personal statement explaining why they wish to study at City.

When an application is successful the student will be issued with an acceptance letter, student number, supporting visa documentation, where applicable, and guidance for the next stage of admissions.

Module selection

Students will need to provisionally select their modules before arrival. Applicants will receive a list of available modules upon receipt of application.

Accommodation

There is limited accommodation for students coming to study for a single term. Students who intend to study for a single term can register their interest in accommodation by emailing study-abroad@city.ac.uk.

Courses are assessed by coursework and examination. A grade of 40% is required to pass a module.

Academic calendar	Autumn term (term 1): September – January. Spring term (term 2): January – June.	
Is it possible to enrol onto modules from other faculties?	Students can enroll on modules from with School of Communication & Creativity, School of Policy & Global Affairs & the Department of Psychology	
Departments	Economics, English, International Politics, Journalism, Music, Psychology, Sociology.	
Language of teaching	English. All exchange students must meet the standard language requirements for entry to City, University of London. Generally this is IELTS 6.5 or equivalent (IELTS 7 for Journalism).	
Centre for Language Studies	Exchange students are able to study a foreign language (free of charge) during their time at City. Courses are available in Arabic, French, German, Mandarin and Spanish. More information can be found at: www.city.ac.uk/arts-social-sciences/centre-for-language-studies .	
Credit system	2 UK credits = 1 ECTS.	
Usual work load	It is recommended that students take 4 modules per term for a full course load. Each term-long class passed is worth 15 credits (7.5 ECTS equivalent).

Cost of accommodation	Approximately £500 - £1,000 per month (varies significantly depending on area).
