AWARD REQUIREMENTS

There are two key components to the UQ Employability Award Program:

1. Participating in and reflecting on extra-curricular activities (experiential learning)

Extra-curricular activities will enhance your student experience and can give you a competitive edge after graduation.

You will need to complete and reflect on at least:

- 100 hours of work experience
- 100 hours of volunteering
- Five supplementary activities

While details of activities are outlined in this guide to help you plan ahead, please note that access to some activities is limited due to a competitive application process or specific discipline/study-related requirements.

2. Attending a mock interview

Once you have completed the extra-curricular activity requirements, you will be invited to submit an application to attend a mock interview with an advisor from the UQ Careers Service. At the interview, you will be asked about the experiences that you engaged in as part of the UQ Employability Award, and reflect on the skills you have gained throughout the program.

Getting started

Once you have registered to participate in the program, you will be able to record your experiences in StudentHub, as well as register your attendance at events.

You can enroll in the program at any time during your degree, but you will need to submit your application to attend your mock interview by **15 May** if you are graduating in Semester 1, and **2 October** if you are graduating in Semester 2. The program has been designed to complement your studies and will not extend your degree.

If you have successfully completed all of the required program components, you will receive an official statement of attainment upon graduation that attests to your enhanced skill set and experience.
