# **Mexican Cultural Heritage and Social Challenges**

#### Course intention within the general study plan context:

Basic humanities course in which students will understand, identify and analyze aspects of Mexico's culture and social challenges so that they can assimilate them and integrate them into their cultural knowledge.

No prior knowledge is required.

As a learning outcome students will carry out dynamics related to the diverse art expressions.

### Course objective:

Upon completion of this course, students will be able to comprehend diverse popular artistic expressions that form part of the Mexican culture and identity, through an analysis of historical and cultural elements and concepts; they will also be able to understand the social dynamics needed for a global culture of inclusion and cero social violence with an insight in the Mexican context.

#### Course topics and subtopics:
