ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Our standard academic entry requirement is a 'B' average (or a cumulative GPA of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale). You must be able to evidence at least two complete semesters of study on your academic transcript at the time of application.

Students whose first language is not English must also meet the English language requirements for the subject areas in which they wish to study.
