The University's reputation is based on the quality of its teaching and research. We're consistently ranked in the top 50 universities in the world. We're 22nd in the 2024 QS World Rankings, and 1st in Scotland.

A student city

Arts & culture

Edinburgh has been an inspiration to artists and writers for centuries; it was named the world's first UNESCO City of Literature in recognition of the city's rich literary heritage. The medieval Old Town and neoclassical New Town are protected as UNESCO World Heritage Centres; their contrasting architectural styles make Edinburgh's cityscape unique.

In the summer months the pace of city life accelerates as Edinburgh's world-famous annual festivals get under way. The city hosts 30 festivals each year, which attract almost four million visitors to the city, and many of them take place either on campus or near to the University making for a vibrant addition to student life.

Study Abroad & Exchanges

Study Abroad

This is a very flexible programme and your studies in Edinburgh can count towards your final degree at your home university. Even if your University does not have an exchange agreement with us you may be eligible to apply to the programme.

As a Study Abroad student you would pay tuition fees to the University of Edinburgh.

Exchanges

We have around 300 student exchange partners in nearly 40 countries worldwide. You can check with an adviser in your home institution if your University is one of our exchange partners.

As an exchange student, you would continue to pay tuition fees to your university, not to the University of Edinburgh.

Students who would like to come on exchange in Edinburgh must be nominated by their home institutions. If you are nominated on a subject-specific exchange, you will be required to take majority of your courses in that particular subject area.

What you can study

You will be taught alongside students who are enrolled in full degree programmes at Edinburgh across 20 different schools. A wide range of courses are available across these subject areas.
