Department of Chinese and History (CAH)

- A degree programme in Chinese and History with two streams:
 - 1) Chinese; and
 - 2) History and Cultural Heritage
- Minors in Art History and Archaeology, Chinese for Professional Purposes, Modern and Contemporary Chinese Literature, and Culture and Heritage Management
- Gateway Education courses related to Chinese culture

Department of Media and Communication (COM)
