

Information for incoming exchange students 2025/26

Application

Exchange students must be nominated by one of our partner universities and will then be sent an application form. Applicants must ensure they have a passport, their most recent transcript of results and their English language test results (if applicable). They will also have to write a personal statement explaining why they wish to study at The City Law School. When an application is successful the student will be issued with an acceptance letter, student number, supporting visa documentation, where applicable, and guidance for the next stage of admissions.

Exchange students from a non-majority English-speaking country must meet the standard language requirements for entry to City, University of London. Generally this is IELTS 6.5 or equivalent.

There is limited accommodation for students coming to study for a single term. Students who intend to study for a single term can register their interest in accommodation by emailing study-abroad@citystgeorges.ac.uk.

Cost of living

Approximately £600-£1,200 per month for accommodation (varies depending on area and housing type). Approximately £800 per month for other expenses.

Academic workload

Students should take 4 modules per term for a full course load. Each term-long class is worth 15 credits (7.5 ECTS, 2 UK credits = 1 ECTS).

Assessment and grading

Courses are assessed by coursework and examination. A grade of 40% is required to pass a module.

Grading system

- A Pass with Distinction: ≥ 70%
- B+ Pass with Merit: 65-69%
- B Pass with Merit: 60-64%
- C+ Pass: 55-59%
- C Pass: 50-54%
- D Pass: 40-49%
- Fail: 0-39%
