2. Exchange Program Information

There are 2 programs to choose from, depending on the applicant's Japanese language proficiency.

*Students are allowed to take the same program for 2 consecutive semesters.

Academic Program (Advanced Level Japanese)	
Language requirement	N2 level on the Japanese-Language Proficiency Test (JPT525 level, J-CAT250 level, or JLCAT B1 level) or Above *When applying, Students should submit the JLPT certificate or other documents showing equivalent proficiency.
Courses / Credits	-Students choose from a list of courses open to international students. (Japanese language and liberal arts courses *list of courses can be found on this website). -Students should take at least 7 courses to maintain their visa status. -Students can take up to 10 courses. -Language courses are worth 1 credit, and liberal arts courses are worth 2 credits per course (most of the courses are 90 min. classes once a week) -Students register for classes during the orientation period. -Course syllabus search website (in Japanese) https://up.swu.ac.jp/uprx/ *Not all courses are open to international students.


Intensive Japanese Language Program (Intermediate Level Japanese)	
Language requirement	Must have studied basic Japanese (JLPT N3 level, or CEFR A2 level, or JPT430 level or J-CAT200 level recommended) before arrival.
Courses / Credits	<p>-The program offers 7 Japanese language courses excluding Internship Program, worth a total of 7 credits, specially designed for non-degree students.</p> <p>Depending on the placement test result, students will be advised to take all or part of the courses. (*Course details are on the program website)</p> <p>-Students should take at least 7 courses to maintain their student visa status.</p> <p>-Students may also take liberal arts courses (Taught in English or in Japanese *depending on students' Japanese level) open to non-degree students within the course registration limit of 10 courses (including Japanese language courses).</p> <p>-Language courses are worth 1 credit per class, and liberal arts courses are worth 2 credits. (most of the courses are 90 min. classes once a week)</p> <p>-Students register for classes during the orientation period.</p> <p>-Students with sufficient Japanese proficiency by the end of the Intensive Japanese Language Program are eligible to register for the "SWU Academic Program" in the following semester.</p>

3. ONLINE Japanese Language Program



SWU provides an online program for international students from July to August. This program is aimed at students who have completed the introductory level of Japanese. It targets students who cannot participate in an actual study abroad or those who want to improve their Japanese language skills before studying abroad in Japan.

***If the program fee waiver for this program is not included in the student exchange agreement at your university, it could be negotiated. Please contact SWU inbound team for details.**

Program Outline and Language Requirement	<p>A new short-term ONLINE language program for those who want to enhance their Japanese proficiency without traveling to Japan. This program also helps those who plan to join the semester program(Intensive Japanese Language Program) at SWU to get ready for their academic life in Japan before an actual study abroad.</p> <p>Must have completed introductory-level Japanese.</p> <p>eg) Completed 250-300 hours of Japanese language study / Finished studying with the following textbooks: "Minna no Nihongo I & II", "GENKI: An Integrated Course in Elementary Japanese I & II"</p>

Each class focuses on a specific topic to acquire new Japanese vocabulary and expressions. It also invites SWU supporter students to join the class as conversation partners and audience for presentation sessions. Those who have achieved close to the JLPT N3 upon completing this program and are interested in an actual semester study abroad are eligible for our “Intensive Japanese Language Program.” *Students must undergo a separate application for the semester program stated in [7. Application Procedure].</p> </div> </div>

Host Sister	<p>Each international student studying at SWU for over a semester is assigned a “Host Sister.” A Host Sister is a student volunteer that helps international students’ school life. Host Family	<p>For students who wish, we match them with a “Host Family.” A Host Family will allow students to experience the typical lifestyle of a modern Japanese family. Students will enjoy spending quality time together. Host Family will welcome each student to their home and occasionally go out on weekends.</p>

	 
Language Exchange and Conversation Partners	For students who wish to improve their Japanese, SWU offers a one-on-one language exchange and/or conversation partner, depending on the students' needs. 7. Application Procedure

Semester Program application will be made through a Web Application System that receives students' application material online. We kindly ask you to follow the procedure and deadline for applying for our semester program.



1. Nominated by Home Institution:

Please be nominated by a home institution. Using the designated nomination list (excel format) is required.

2. Receive Invitation for SpeedVisa (Students only) :

Nominated students will receive an invitation email from the SpeedVisa Support Team to join SpeedVisa (wecare@s.s-visa.com). Push the [Accept the Invitation] button for authentication.

*The link button expires in 10 days.

3. Submit Online Application:

Students should input the necessary information and upload mandatory documents for the application.

Though the final application deadline is May 25th / November 25th, we strongly advise the students to finish their initial input by May 20th / November 20th, so there will be enough time for SWU to review and ask for any revision or addition, if necessary, before the deadline.

List of documents and data to be uploaded are:

- a) Transcript of Home Institution in English
- b) Certificate of Enrollment (Student Registration) in English
- c) Letter of Recommendation from Home Institution in English or Japanese (free format)
- d) ID photo data: ratio:4×3 / pixel:354×472 (300dpi) / format: jpg or jpeg
 - *The photo data will be used for COE application and student ID
 - *The photo should be taken facing forward with a plain background with no shadows
- e) Passport copy
- f) Hirao Scholarship Program Application Form ***only for those applicable/designated format**
- g) JLPT score copy *only for those who have them

In addition to the above, “Personal Information and Consent Form” will be sent from SWU to the nominated students.

4. Join a Zoom interview session:

Students who applied for the Intensive Japanese Language Program without an N3 certificate may be asked to take part in a Zoom interview session to have their Japanese level checked.

5. Receive official acceptance:


Once SWU has officially approved the application, students will receive a notice via email.

8. VISA Application and Resident Registration

These are the essential procedures students are required to carry out before and after arriving in Japan.

<p>Visa Application</p> <p><u>*Mandatory</u></p>	<p>After SWU officially accepts the student application for the selected program, SWU will apply for the Certificate of Eligibility (CoE).</p> <p>Once the CoE is issued, SWU will send the students the PDF data of the Letter of Acceptance (LOA) and COE (email). Once they receive these documents, they should apply for their visa at their home country's nearest Japanese Embassy or Consulate.</p>
<p>Residence Card & National Health Insurance</p> <p><u>*Mandatory</u></p>	<p>Students who enter Japan with their student visa will receive a "Residence Card." This card notes students' visa status, stay period, and other residency information. Within 2 weeks after arrival, students must complete residency registration procedures at the local ward office and become a member of the "National Health Insurance."</p> <p>Students must always carry their Residence Card during their stay in Japan. The National Health Insurance will be valid throughout the student's stay in Japan. Students pay only 30% of the medical fee (except for some services and special operations) by paying the monthly insurance premium.</p>
<p>Part-Time Work Permission</p>	<p>To start a part-time job, international students must apply for work permission <i>Shikakugai Katsudo Kyoka</i> ("Application for Permission to Engage in Activity Other Than That Permitted Under the Status of Residence Previously Granted"). This can be done at the airport when entering Japan, and those who plan to work part-time are strongly recommended to apply for permission at the airport. Otherwise, students have to go to the Immigration Bureau later. No fee is charged for the work permit.</p> <p><NOTE></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> -International students can only work up to 28 hours per week when the University is in seeing, and up to 8 hours (also up to 40 hours per week) a day during school vacations. -Work in the adult and gambling business is strictly prohibited.
