Acceptance	<p>Following the successful online application, Acceptance Letter and Visa/Residence Permit Letter (if required) will be available for download in Mobility-Online</p>	
Fields of Study	<p>University of Graz is a public university with an enrolment of 31.100 students and a strong international profile offering more than 120 BA, MA and PhD degrees which are open to exchange students. The university's regional focus on South-Eastern Europe is one of the defining factors throughout all areas of study</p> <p>Restrictions</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Lab placements</u> are generally difficult and cannot be guaranteed • <u>Joint Degree Programs</u> are only open to exchange students enrolled in one of these programs already at their home university (= partner in the Joint Degree program) • <u>Translation/interpretation/transcultural communication</u> is only open to students if they have a clearly identifiable focus on the German language in their degree at the home university 	
ECTS requirements	<p>All exchange students must successfully complete a minimum of 16 ECTS per semester at University of Graz as their primary host institution (exceptions: research stays, short-term programs, Erasmus traineeships)</p> <p>If academically relevant, additional courses can be taken at other Graz universities via co-enrollment (no extra cost). Those courses will NOT count towards the ECTS requirement of University of Graz.</p>

Early exams / Alternative exam modes	<p>Cannot be guaranteed!</p> <p>Whether or not early exams / alternative exam arrangements are possible is subject to the decision of each professor for his/her course. Students intending to leave early must contact professors early on and definitely before finalizing their travel arrangements.</p> <p>NO early exams ➔ for lecture-type courses at the Faculty of Business and of the field of English and American Studies.</p>	
Housing	<p>MONTCLAIR GRANTEES of the “Overseas Neighbors Scholarship” ➔ housing arrangements will be made by the City of Graz / Overseas Neighbours Graz</p> <p>ALL OTHER STUDENTS: will make their own housing arrangements.</p> <p><i>Further information ➔ Check on the Orientation Platform</i></p>	
Language Requirements	<p>University of Graz recommends language level B2 in German in order to take full advantage of the mobility. Students who will only take courses in English must have language level B2 in English.</p> <p>Students who will only take courses in English <u>must check whether they can find enough English-taught courses</u> to fulfill their home university's credit requirements.</p>	
German Language courses	<p>Treffpunkt Sprachen offers a 3-week German Intensive Language Course (6 ECTS credits incl. in transcript) in September and February before the start of the semester at a reduced fee. Also, German courses during the semester are offered.</p> <p><i>Further information ➔ Check on the Orientation Platform</i></p>	
Buddy program	<p>Buddies are Austrian students interested in supporting international exchange students as unpaid volunteers during their time in Graz (pick-up service, support in practical matters, etc.).</p> <p><i>Further information ➔ Check on the Orientation Platform</i></p>	

Students - special needs	<p>Integrated Studies offers support for students with special needs and counselling. Students are advised to get in touch once they are nominated and well ahead of the start of their mobility.</p> <p>Students in need of counselling are also advised to contact the Counselling Center for Students well ahead of their arrival if an appointment immediately after arrival is needed (approx. 3-month waiting period).</p> <p><i>Further information → Check on the Orientation Platform</i></p>
Health & Safety Policy	<p>The compulsory student union fee includes liability and accident insurance. (way to/from the university as well as on campus). This does, however not replace full health insurance coverage for the exchange stay.</p> <p>Safety facilities and trainings are provided in specific departments where applicable (e.g., labs).</p>
Health Insurance	<p>EU/EEA students need to bring their European health insurance card (EHIC) to Austria. The EHIC must be valid for the full duration of their stay.</p> <p>Non-EU/EEA students nominated for 2 semesters are required by law to register for Austrian health insurance upon arrival (assistance and more information available during the mandatory Orientation Days). This insurance will NOT cover the student's journey to and from Graz or medical evacuation and repatriation – the student has to make sure s/he purchases travel insurance accordingly.</p> <p>Non-EU/EEA students nominated for 1 semester are free to choose their insurance as long as this insurance is in accordance with the requirements for an Austrian visa application. For details students have to contact the Austrian embassy in their country of residence. The insurance must also cover their journey to Graz including medical evacuation and repatriation.</p>
Visa & Residence Permit	<p>For detailed information go to → https://oead.at/en/to-austria/entry-and-residence/</p> <p><u>Student jobs available/allowed?</u> Visa regulations make finding a job very difficult (unless students also hold an EU passport). Graz University has no facilities to help secure a job or advise students in this matter. Students should NOT rely on getting a job in Graz when budgeting their exchange!</p>
Transcripts	<p>Students are expected to initiate and download their electronically signed transcript within the timeframe of their enrollment and provide the transcript and cover letter to the home university. Home universities can verify the transcript online.</p> <p>Courses taken at other universities in Graz via co-enrollment will come on a separate transcript issued by the university at which the courses were taken.</p> <p><i>Further information → check on the Orientation Platform</i></p>
